

Recently I was warding off evil spirits from the new Quadrant Care Residential home in Church Street, by performing the 'Topping Out' ceremony (placing the last tile on the roof). Not every day is one hoisted thirty feet into the air by scissor lift! The Mayoress and I were also privileged to attend the Golden Jubilee celebrations of the Royal Anglian Regiment at RAF Duxford when new colours were presented by the Duke of Gloucester. Thank you to all who attended the Charity Race Night - we raised a goodly sum for the appeal. There are some good things to come too and the Christmas Concert will go ahead on December 11, so I hope we can fill the Methodist Church.

Some good news for Dunstable which are new announcements as I write, but you will know all about them by the time this is distributed. Firstly, the link from the M1 to the Woodside Industrial area has cleared its last hurdle and will commence as planned. This will benefit all residents but especially those on the Eastern side of Dunstable (Poynters and Luton Roads very especially). Secondly, I understand that the police presence in Dunstable is to be strengthened by the stationing of further police officers operating from Dunstable Police Station. A very welcome development.

Now may I have a little rant? We have a 20mph blanket speed limit for the vast majority of roads in Dunstable - some may not like it, but it is a fact. The object of the exercise is obviously to reduce vehicle speeds, but it appears that there are a significant number of drivers determined to ignore it. A5-M1 Link Update

Following the Secretaries of State for Transport and Communities and Local Government decision to proceed with the A5 - M1 link Dunstable Northern Bypass scheme. advanced work has started in the area.

UK Power Networks (UKPN) is currently on site in order to upgrade and relocate existing overhead power cables underground. The upgrading work is part of UKPN scheduled improvement work. However these works have been brought forward because they are vital preparation for the A5-M1 Link road.

The Highways Agency is due to start main construction work on the A5-M1 Link road in early 2015.

The Scheme consists of:

- 4.5km of new two lane dual carriageway;
- a roundabout at the western end with the
- a roundabout near the middle at the intersection with the A5120 Bedford Road;
- a new M1 Motorway interchange at the eastern end which would be called Junction 11a;
- a new bridge to carry Sundon Road over the new link;
- the diversion of B579 Luton Road on the eastern side of the M1 motorway around the junction and a realignment on the western side of the M1 with two new junctions;
- a new over-bridge across the M1;
- two bridges over the A5-M1 link for pedestrians and farm vehicles access;
- provision of lighting from the A5 to A5120 as well as signs, safety barriers and drainage to the appropriate standards;



Jack Adams-Rimmer has been working for Dunstable Town Council for three months as a Community Servicess Assistant. As he is new to the Community Services Team we thought we would get to know him better by shining the spotlight on him.



Tell us the best bit about your role as a Community Services Assistant?

My role as a Community Services Assistant is to assist in the day to day running of The Mayfield Centre based at Downside. I signpost people to the services that The Mayfield Centre provides and I also work at Grove Corner, which is based next to Grove House Gardens and provides drop in sessions for young people.

Before you started working for **Dunstable Town Council, what did** you do?

Before I started working for DTC I was attending the University of Northampton studying BA Sports Development, whilst holding part time employment at the White Lion Restaurant. I graduated in July of 2014 and I attained a 2:1 honours degree. I had also completed some voluntary placements at Downside Neighbourhood Centre and Tithe Farm Neighbourhood Centre.

What football team do you support?

The football team I support is Manchester United. I have been a fan since I was very young due to the influence of family members and have been to a number of games.

When you started you were straight into the summer activities programme, how did you find that?

I was very pleased with the fact I could get involved straight away with the summer activities especially as I ran the football sessions at Creasey Park Community Football Centre. I enjoyed

the whole experience of working with parents and children within the community.

The Mayfield Centre will also be hosting the Citizens Advice Bureau on Wednesday evenings. Not only that, we will be holding smoking cessation clinics from November.

You work at various locations, The **Mayfield Centre and Grove Corner** can you tell us a bit more about these centres?

The Mayfield Centre provides support, advice and a range of opportunities

such as training, events and activities for the whole community. The Centre has a bank of computers with free internet access. The main purpose of the centre is to meet the needs of the community.

Young people can use Grove Corner for free as a chill-out place to do college work, school work, meet friends, make new friends, play free pool, use the online computers, play music, take part in activities, have a cup of tea and have something to eat.

What skills do you think you have brought to this role?

I like people and feel I am very approachable. I am also quite good at IT and have recently undertaken training with Job Centre Plus to enable people to open a Universal job account and The Library on the 'Learn My Way' program which enables people to easily access health related information. New services and changes in delivery are happening quite quickly at The Mayfield Centre and I would encourage people to keep checking the Town Council website for updates.
