The Mayor's Welcome

It is said that as one grows older, time passes more quickly. When one is kept busy, that also helps time go by. Put the two together and my Mayoral year seems to have slipped by. Over 120 engagements later, on top of the usual Council meetings (the Mayor attends the three main committees and chairs the full Council), there are already another 16 engagements in the diary up to 14 May, the day before I will hand over to the next Mayor.

After a quiet period post-Christmas into the middle of January, more outside engagements, invitations from other Mayors, businesses and other organisations, were slotted into the diary. Along with the Mayoress, I have been especially pleased to visit the Sea Cadets (one of my charities) on two occasions. The first was to the Dunstable Unit Mess (Trafalgar) Dinner; the second to their Awards Evening. It is always good to see a smart turn out and witness young people, in this case, the cadets and Marines, receive awards for their many achievements.

My Charity Dinner was held on Friday 24 February at Hospitality Central, Central Bedfordshire College. One hundred and twenty two of us enjoyed an excellent meal prepared and served by the staff and catering students. King's Jazz added colour with their skilful playing to the evening. It was pleasing to have received so many compliments about the dinner which raised money for my three charities – Sorted, Signposts and the Sea Cadets.

Shrove Tuesday (Pancake Day) brought together some of the town's businesses. Spicer & Co., Deakin-White, HQ Sports Bar and Crepe Cottage organised, hosted and provided the pancakes for 18 teams to show their running and tossing abilities. A team of PCSOs and one from the College catering department also took part. HQ Sports Bar won the race with the students worthy runners-up.

The Mayor's Civic Service was held at the Priory Church on Sunday 19 March. I thank the Reverend Richard Andrews, Gemma Palmer and the Ardley Hill Academy choir which sang 'One World', Isabella Clawson-Maila who sang Pie Jesu, the standard bearers and the Sea Cadets and Marines, the Town Clerk and Chief Executive who read one of the lessons and the Priory Choir for their contributions to the Service. Also thanks to the Trefoil Guild for their help with the refreshments after the Service and the Mayoral and Democratic Services Officer for the administration.

The A5-M1 Link road and the Woodside connection are destined to be opened in April. Once open, improvements to our High Street can gradually take place. In the forthcoming months Dunstable will have a completely refurbished Leisure Centre, a new Library and community rooms, more shops, a cleaner town, improved signage, continuing improvements to our two town centre gardens and cemetery, a refurbished area around our War Memorial, themed markets and an events programme for which any town would be proud.

Work has started in Bennet Memorial Recreation Ground to build the splash park and the café which are destined to be ready this Summer – let's hope for some good summer days.

I do thank all those who have kindly supported me in so many ways in my Mayoral year; my Mayoress, fellow councillors, officers, individuals from local businesses, organisations and friends. It has been a partnership and for me has resulted in an interesting, informative and enjoyable year. Thank you all.

This year the Council has been able to set a budget at a nil per cent increase on the Dunstable Town Council element of your council tax bill whilst also improving and increasing the range of quality of life services delivered by the Council in Dunstable.

If you live in a Band D property in Dunstable you will pay an annual charge of £175.21 to Dunstable Town Council, no increase on last year's charge. An illustration of the services provided by the Council and how the Council is working with its partners towards 'Making Dunstable a Better Place' is given later in this edition.

The spring sees the launch of the Council's events programme and this year the Council will be starting things off with two events in April and May. St George's Day will be celebrated with an improved range of activities centred in Priory Gardens and May sees the return of the very popular 'Around the World' event that will also take place in Priory Gardens. Please note that the Beer and Cider Festival will take place in August this year and I am delighted that the Council can announce Toyah Willcox as our headline act for this year's Party in the Park in July.

June will see the opening of the much anticipated splash park and associated cafeteria that the Town Council has made possible by working in partnership with Central Bedfordshire Council through their Market Town Regeneration Fund. I am particularly pleased with this project which I think will be very popular with our residents judging by the amount of positive comments we have received on the Council's Facebook page. I also believe that it will attract more visitors to the town centre thereby contributing to the Council's efforts in trying to regenerate Dunstable.

I hope readers will take the time to look at the centre pages of this edition as the photo montage clearly illustrates why Dunstable is prospering and why the town featured in the top 10 list of house price increases over the past 12 months.

10 Years of Croquet at Priory Gardens

Central Bedfordshire College Student Joins Championship Football Club

Footballer Freddie Hinds realises his dream

Central Bedfordshire College are delighted to share the great news that Freddie Hinds (Luton Town Football Club Youth Team Scholars) was signed by Championship Football Club Bristol City for an undisclosed fee on transfer deadline day in January. This is a giant 2 leagues above LTFC and head coach Lee Johnson said: "Freddie is almost in the Nicky Maynard mould with his attributes. He's got a good centre of gravity and certainly knows where the net is."

Freddie was a product of the Hatters' academy system that sees their Youth Team Scholars attend Central Bedfordshire College for their academic studies twice a week as well as using the first class training facilities at Creasey Park Community Football Centre. This academic year also saw Cameron McJannet join Premier League club Stoke City in the summer from LTFC Youth Team.

Freddie was in the second year of his scholarship having finished his first year as top scorer for the Youth Team. Freddie joined the club as an Under-8 and attended Central Bedfordshire College from 2015 as did Midfielder Tyreeq Bakinson and Defender Akin Famewo who have

now both signed professional contracts with LTFC first team.

Karyn Godfrey the Learning Area Manager for Sport at the College said: "We are all thrilled for Freddie to be joining a Championship side and wish him great success. We will be following his career with great interest, what a fantastic 18th birthday present!"

The College prides itself on ensuring its students are realistic about their future and understand the highly competitive aspect of the professional footballing arena. It therefore ensures a strong academic focus so students are well equipped for careers on and off the pitch. With 98% progression and a second "good" Ofsted rating, the academic standards are on a par with the high standard of coaching which has produced players such as Crystal Palace's Keshi Anderson. The College's squads are all based at Creasey Park Community Football Centre in Dunstable and have scooped seven league titles and two league cups to date.

Creasey Summer League

This summer Creasey Park will be running an 11v11 pre-season adult summer league. Instead of your club secretary doing all the work, Creasey Park will organise the fixtures, provide the pitch and organise the referees. Playing on our FA approved 3G astro turf pitch the league will run over a 4 week period on Wednesdays 12, 19, 26 July & 2 August from 7.00 pm - 10.00 pm. Ideally there will be 8 teams, guaranteeing you a game each week.

Games will be a straight 40 minutes with rolling substitutions and officiated by qualified referees. The league will be administered by Creasey Park, with weekly results and league table posted on our website www.dunstable.gov.uk/cpcfc, where you can also find further information. Before and after your game you can buy refreshments and relax in the comfortable licensed clubhouse while watching some live sport or playing a game of pool or darts.

Team entry fee is £25 per week, based on a squad of 13 players this is under £2 per player per week. So ask you club secretary to contact us or make the call yourself to register your interest or find out further information.

An Exhibition on the History & Culture of Tea

On Saturday 25 March Dunstable Town Council launched a new exhibition, *The History & Culture of Tea*, timed to coincide with the 150th Anniversary of Ceylon Tea.

The Town Mayor Cllr Peter Hollick, Mayoress Cllr Ann Sparrow and David Ashlee Town Clerk and Chief Executive were delighted to host Her Excellency Ms Amari Wijewardene, High Commissioner for Sri Lanka and a delegation from the Sri Lanka Tea Board led by their Chairman, Mr Rohan Pethiyagoda, along with other guests, to celebrate both the opening and the anniversary.

The event started with the High Commissioner lighting the first candle on a traditional Sri Lankan lamp stand followed by the Town Mayor and others. This was followed by a speech from the High Commissioner thanking the Town Council for being involved with celebrations to commemorate the anniversary and for creating the exhibition. The Town Mayor, Cllr Hollick, expressed his delight that Her Excellency and the Tea Board delegation had taken time out of a very busy week to be in Dunstable for the occasion.

The Sri Lanka Tea Board presented Dunstable Town Council with a bust of James Taylor, who planted the first tea plants in Sri Lanka 150 years ago, specially commissioned for the 2017 celebrations and a model of the tea clipper Cutty Sark for the exhibition display case.

Presentations of commemorative crystal clocks were then made by Cllr Hollick to Her Excellency the High Commissioner and by David Ashlee to the Chairman of the Sri Lanka Tea Board. A delightful talk delivered by Rohan Pethiyagoda followed ending with a tasting session of teas from all the growing Regions in Sri Lanka.

This fascinating exhibition is now open, free of charge, Monday to Saturday 10.00 am until 4.00 pm and if you enjoy tea then look out for various talks and tastings which will be available soon.

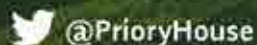

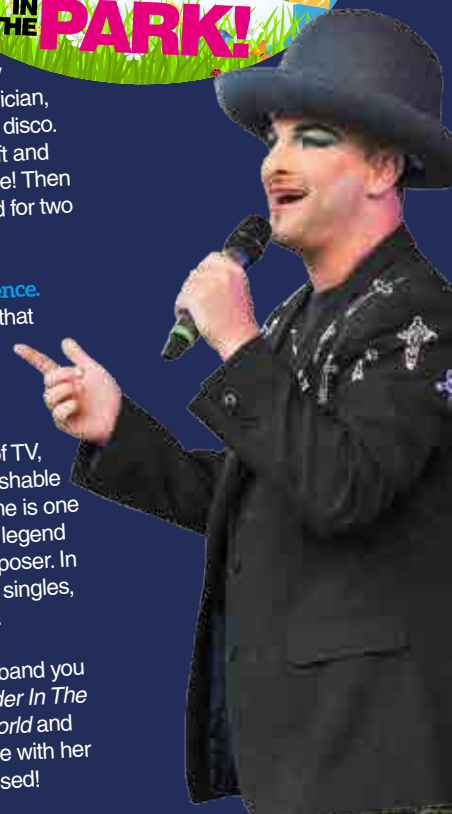

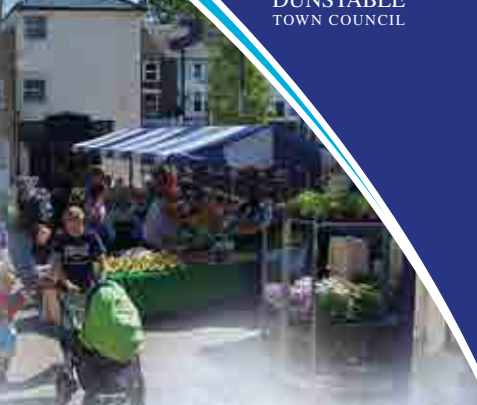

Grove Corner

Grove Corner is a Young People's Centre in the middle of Dunstable. Drop-in sessions run three nights per week for those aged 13 to 18 years old; Monday and Wednesdays from 7.00 pm to 9.30 pm and Friday 8.00 pm to 9.30 pm. There is also a Junior Youth Club on Fridays from 6.00 pm to 8.00 pm for those aged 10 to 13.

At Grove Corner there is a chance to play FREE pool, FREE table football, play your own music through the in-room speaker, access computers with the internet and use the FREE wifi. There is also an affordable tuck shop; with burgers, bacon sandwiches, pizzas, chocolates, sweets and more on sale.

The Junior Group enjoy participating in arts and crafts which they are able to take home at the end of the session.

Each month there is a specific theme; currently both groups are looking at healthy relationships with others and car safety. OSCAR, a road safety car visited Juniors and Seniors where both groups were able to watch a short video in a simulated car on distractions for drivers. Both groups were thankful for the experience and gained further insight into the importance of car safety in all aspects.

Each month, relevant professionals visit the sessions to discuss the topic the groups are looking at and to let the young people know where additional help, support and advice is available.

Bennett's Splash

The residents of Dunstable will certainly be able to make a splash and relax this summer with the new splash park and cafeteria being built in Bennett Memorial Recreation Ground.

These fantastic new additions to the town can be enjoyed by one and all.

The new splash park will be a 200m² wet play surface with 16 super soaking water features ranging from gentle mists, spray arches to tipping buckets and spray shooter cannons that will entertain all ages. The splash park will be located directly in front of the current pavilion which will also undergo a major re-development converting a section of it into the new Splashside Cafe.

This new, free-to-use facility represents an investment of over £500,000 in the town centre and has been made possible thanks to Dunstable Town Council assisted by Central Bedfordshire Council's Market Town Regeneration Fund.


The new splash park and café forms part of the Dunstable Town Council Corporate Plan, aiding its vision "to help make Dunstable a better place" and "to contribute to the regeneration of the town centre" and "to improve and develop the provision of green and open space in the town". This new facility will enhance current provision in the park.

The public will still be able to enjoy the green open space for dog walking, exercising and playing tennis. Children will be able to use the playground already situated in the park and footballers will still be able to make use of the two adult sized football pitches that will remain. The Council's vision is that the new facilities will make Dunstable an even better place to visit and will hopefully attract more people into the town centre.

The new café will be perfect for those enjoying a day in the park or just passing through. Customers can sample a range of coffees, teas, milkshakes, soft drinks and healthy fruit juices. Those with an appetite can take advantage of a selection of sandwiches, wraps, pizzas and jacket potatoes. To make life easy for those busy parents the children will be catered for too with the kid's lunch package.

As part of the Town Council's Environmental Policy the splash park incorporates a sustainable water system, resulting in the water used for the splash park being cleaned and recirculated, reducing water usage.

The splash park is expected to open by late June 2017 and will be open 7 days a week until Sunday 3 September 2017.

Opening times will 10.00 am to 6.00 pm for both the Bennett's Splash and Splashside Café. After this initial first year the splash park will be open annually from mid-May to the end of August.

Due to the number of parking restrictions on the roads surrounding Bennett Memorial Recreation Ground, **it is strongly advised to park in Ashton Square car park, off Bull Pond Lane**, with its 387 spaces. This car park is only a minute walk to the park.

Councillor Liz Jones, Chairman of the Town Council's Grounds and Environmental Services Committee, said: "I am delighted to see the splash park come to fruition after a lot of hard work and planning by Dunstable Town Council officers. I am sure the splash park will bring smiles and laughter to many of our younger residents and visitors to our town when it opens later this summer."

Central Bedfordshire Councillor Executive Member for Regeneration, Cllr Nigel Young commented: "Central Bedfordshire Council's £4 million Market Town Regeneration Fund initiative is providing significant funding to help rejuvenate seven of our important

market towns, at a time when very few other authorities are investing in town centres. I am delighted that Central Bedfordshire Council is working in partnership with Dunstable Town Council to create this fantastic splash park, along with a number of other, highly visible, projects in the town. The splash park is a great project that I am sure will give a lot of enjoyment to the local community. With joint funding from both Central Bedfordshire Council and Dunstable Town Council, over £1.2 million will be invested in various projects in Dunstable, contributing to its continuing regeneration; projects like the splash park will help ensure the vibrancy of Dunstable, and will help ensure that Dunstable is a place where families want to live, play and work."

New burial and memorial options now available at Dunstable Cemetery

For centuries people have designed and created memorials to remember their loved ones and the Council has recently created a new area at Dunstable Cemetery to provide a new range of burial and memorial options.

Have you recently been bereaved and are unsure what to do with the cremated remains of your loved one? Should they be buried somewhere or scattered in a special place or does that not appeal to you? Sanctum vaults provide the ideal opportunity to place your loved ones cremated remains in a small above ground stone chamber with a personalised plaque and a place for flowers to be laid.

The sanctum vaults are made of Sera Grey polished granite and have a removable internal shelf to allow the interment of one or two sets of cremated remains. The plaque on the front can be personalised to include an inscription and a photo, motif or emblem of your choice.

The Council also realises that families sometimes just need a focal point to remember a loved one or lay flowers, even if they are buried elsewhere. The new memorial kerb plaque garden area at Dunstable Cemetery provides an opportunity to



place a memorial plaque on a polished granite kerb around an attractive feature flowerbed. The area is easy to reach via gently sloping footpaths which are ideal for visitors with mobility difficulties.

The sanctums and the memorial kerb plaques can be leased or placed for a period of either 25 or 35 years for a one-off payment which includes the plaque and where applicable the interment.

Did you know that of your total annual council tax bill, only £175.21 (Band D property) is paid to Dunstable Town Council?
