This year the Council has been able to set a budget at a nil per cent increase on the Dunstable Town Council element of your council tax bill whilst also improving and increasing the range of quality of life services delivered by the Council in Dunstable.

If you live in a Dunstable Band D property, you will pay an annual charge of £175.21 to Dunstable Town Council. This is the third year running of no increase to the Town Council element of your council tax charge. An illustration of the services provided by the Council is given later in this edition.

The spring sees the launch of the Council's events programme and this year the Council will be starting things off with two events in April and May. St George's Day will be celebrated with an improved range of activities centred in Priory Gardens and May sees the Council commemorating the 100-year anniversary of the end of World War I, again in Priory Gardens. June's 'Dunstable Live' is once again set to open the Council's 'Summer of Music' and I am very excited to be able to announce that Altered Images (with Clare Grogan) will be our headline act for this year's Party in the Park in July.

We are also hoping for good weather to support the Council's programme of special markets that will be taking place from April on every second and third Saturday of the month. This year we are trying to develop a farmers market so please make sure you visit the markets and help support local enterprise.

You will also be noticing a number of improvements to the town centre this year. In association with Central Bedfordshire Council, we have been working with a number of town centre retailers that will soon be benefiting from improvements being made to their shop fronts. We hope that this scheme, in association with the major works being planned to High Street North, will have a positive impact on the look of the town centre that will entice more people into the town.



With 2018 marking the 100th anniversary of the end of World War 1 this year's Dunstable in Bloom theme is Remembrance and Peace. There are some lovely plants associated with Remembrance and Peace including Poppies, Forget-Me-Nots, Rosemary, Peace Roses and Lilies. Why not try and fit some of these into your borders, baskets and tubs?







2018 marks the 100th Anniversary of the end of the First World War and the Town Council is leading a project to renovate the memorial in time for the November Armistice Day and Remembrance Services.

The memorial, built in 1952, was originally paid for through public subscription by local Dunstable residents and businesses. The Friends of Priory House and Gardens have chosen the project as their main fund raising activity for 2018 and throughout March they ran an online crowd funding page. This was the first time they had tried crowd funding and they were very pleased with the response and the pledges made by local people. If you made a pledge then thank you for doing so.

The Friends are still keen to reach as many Dunstablians and local businesses as they can who may have an interest in the project and it is not too late to make a financial contribution towards the renovation.

If you would like to support the project please make cheques payable to the Friends of Priory House and Gardens. You can hand cash and cheque donations into Priory House.

Part of the project will be to add the missing names of some of the First and Second World War forgotten heroes of Dunstable to the Roll- Call plaques fixed to the memorial. These names were overlooked when the original memorial was erected and the renovation project is a great opportunity to put this right.

In addition, it is also proposed to add a new stone carved Combined Services emblem to remember those who have given their lives in conflict since the Second World War.

The Friends of Priory House and Gardens are leading on the fund raising but other groups and organisations including the Royal British Legion, Dunstable and District History Society and Dunstable Rotary Club are playing a leading role in supporting the Town Council and the Friends.



Have you recently been bereaved and are unsure what to do with the cremated remains of your loved one? Should they be buried somewhere or scattered in a special place or does that not appeal to you?

Sanctum vaults provide the ideal opportunity to place your loved ones cremated remains in a small above ground stone chamber with a personalised plague and a place for flowers to be laid.

The sanctum vaults are made of Sera Grey polished granite and have a removable internal shelf to allow the interment of one or two sets of cremated remains. The plaque on the front can be personalised to include an inscription and a photo, motif or emblem of your choice.

Families sometimes just need a focal point to remember a loved one or lay flowers, even if they are buried elsewhere. The new memorial kerb plaque garden area at Dunstable Cemetery provides an opportunity to place a memorial plaque on a polished granite kerb around an attractive feature flowerbed. The area is easy to




reach via gently sloping footpaths which are ideal for visitors with mobility difficulties.

The sanctums and the memorial kerb plaques can be leased or placed for a period of either 25 or 35 years for a one-off payment which includes the plaque and where applicable the interment.


# The Crafty Men's Crew and their Creative Shed!







# tlight Meet Councillors Colbourne and Kennedy

In this edition of spotlight, we are shining the light on two of our elected Dunstable Town Councillors, looking into what it is like to be a councillor. In the spotlight is Councillor Terry Colbourne, who is our longest serving Councillor of 22 years, and Councillor Anne Kennedy who recently joined the Council in September 2017.



# Cllr **Terry**

You have been a Councillor now for 22 years, you were Mayor in 2002/03, looking back over your service what have you enjoyed most or has been your biggest achievement?

Obviously the most enjoyable time was that of being the Town Mayor in the Queen's Golden Jubilee year. This gave me a "baptism of fire" as I took office on the Monday and 4 days later there was a full weekend of events in celebration. This also coincided with the first visit of a delegation from Bourgoin-Jallieu with a view of twinning, they fully engaged in our celebrations and later in the year a Dunstable delegation went to France and I signed the Memorandum of Understanding. There were further highlights during the year, but far too many to mention here.

### What made you become a Councillor?

To answer this I must go back to the 1959 General Election when I was studying GCSE 'O 'Level Economics and Public Affairs. Staff considered that a practical experience would be useful so the school organised its own election at which I was a candidate. This gave me my first real insight into politics, an interest that I still have today. In 1986 on retiring from the Armed Forces I moved to Dunstable, joined a political party, a ward committee and was nominated as a candidate for the 1992 Town Council elections, the rest they say "is history".

### Apart from your work here at Dunstable Town Council, what else do you like to do in your spare time?

In the past year I have not had much spare time as being Consort to the Town Mayor has kept me very busy. When I do have leisure time, which is now every day as I am retired, I enjoy using my National Trust membership. This usually means a short break and a visit to a historic property coupled with a cathedral and / or a castle. At home I watch television, mainly documentary, sport and quiz

programmes, share household and gardening duties with my wife and solve the occasional crossword.

### Dunstable has changed a lot since you first joined the council, what has been the biggest change you have seen?

The major changes I have seen have been the loss of much of the town's large employers and the building of the White Lion retail park, ASDA and many large distribution centres. The result of which has led to less footfall in the town and the subsequent loss of specialist local shops. On the plus side the recently opened A5 / M1 link road has significantly reduced the number of heavy vehicles passing through the

### During the rest of your time in office, what would you like to see the Council achieve for Dunstable?

Most comments I receive are about services provided by Central Bedfordshire Council such as car parking charges, state of the High Street and roads. As a Town Councillor I and my colleagues act as a "pressure group" to ensure that local views are known. With regard to the Town Council there is a very long list I would like to see achieved which includes; obtaining more contracts for our Town Ranger and Parks team, reducing the cost of all waste disposal, renovation of the War Memorial, continue winning Green Flags for our parks and cemetery and also Gold medals for Anglia in Bloom. Finally I would very much like to see a Youth Council established to ensure the future of the town.

### If you were a superhero for the day what powers would you have and why?

It would be lovely to be a superhero, but my recollection of Batman and Superman is that their adventures take a little longer than a day. However if I only have a day I would follow their examples and have the power to rid the town of all crime and anti-social behaviour. Any remaining time I would use to build a small stadium with seats for athletics, rugby, football and large outdoor events.



### Cllr Anne Kennedy

You joined the council in September 2017, how have you been enjoying it so far?

I have enjoyed engaging with the public and listening to their views. I felt very honoured to represent Market Traders views at Council.

#### What made you become a Councillor?

I decided to become a Councillor because I was lucky to have been brought up in Dunstable which was a thriving market Town. I hope to be able to influence changes to restore Dunstable to its former glory.

### Do you have any hobbies you like to do outside of your work as councillor?

I have two horses and caring for them takes a lot of my time and energy. I also enjoy spending time at my allotment growing fruit and vegetables and making jams and chutneys from them.

### I hear you have done quite a bit of travelling, where is your favourite place you have been?

I have been very fortunate to travel much of the world and though I absolutely loved Kenya, Indonesia holds a special place in my heart for the varied culture and delicious, naturally vegan, food. Having said that, I would go and live in Granada, Spain in a heartbeat!

#### During the rest of your time in office, what would you like to see the Council achieve for Dunstable?

I would like to see a Labour controlled Council restore the market to local control and management as an important trademark of our town's heritage.

### We always ask everyone this question.....If you were a superhero for the day what powers would you have and why?

If I was a superhero for one day I would like the power to heal. I would use the power to heal all the conflicts and occupations so that refugees could go back to their lands and rebuild their lives, especially for Palestinians who cannot go home.


