I have had the pleasure of starting my Mayoral year with varied visits to local organisations. Perhaps the most rewarding are those where citizens are recognised for their service to the community – e.g. Cheering Volunteering supported by Central Bedfordshire Council and the St John Ambulance recognising hours of service in the last year and years of service.

There have also been visits to Scout AGMs and the Sea Cadets (further volunteering by the staff). There have been two 'Big Lunch' events, one organised by the Woodfield and Downside Residents Association, the other by the 'Incredible Edible' volunteers at their site on Katherine Drive. It was also pleasing, along with the Mayoress, to attend a 'street party' at the Vale Academy and watch the burying of a time capsule.

I was pleased to open the first of our 'Summer of Music' events – Dunstable Live! (Saturday 18 June) and the first Band Concert (Dunstable Town Band on Sunday 26 June). Residents and visitors took a step back in time to see the large range of classic cars (Saturday 11 June) in Priory Gardens. Added interest came in the form of the impressive Help for Heroes Truck Convoy with at least 100 lorries, sounding their horns, making their way along High Street South. I had the pleasure of waving them through. The organisers and drivers were moved by the crowd along the route, even one or two moved to tears with the support shown.

My first Mayoral event to raise money for my chosen charities took place on Saturday 25 June at the new independent living apartments in Priory View, Church Street. 100 guest representatives from local organisations, friends and colleagues and residents of Priory View, made it a successful morning. Ukie Toons (a Ukulele group) provided background music. There is a 'wow' factor at Priory View – the café, restaurant and therapy area are all open to the public. Do go and see what there is for 'later living'.

My chosen charities are the Sea Cadets (youngsters learning about and developing their skills on the water), Signposts (supporting young homeless) and Sorted (a counselling service for young people). I do hope you will support future events and contribute to these worthy causes.

At Mayor Making I said I would visit the shops and businesses in the Town Centre (and I have already started), not only to introduce myself but, more importantly, to build on the work of the Dunstable Joint Committee (made up of representatives from Central Bedfordshire and Dunstable Town Councils together with participants from local businesses) which is doing good work to help increase footfall in the town. The Special Saturdays, an addition to the Saturday market (on the first Saturday of each month), have been well received.

Your Town Council promotes many events; as well as the music concerts and Classic Motor Rally you can also enjoy 'Brewed for Dunstable', the annual town fireworks and more. Please support them; a considerable amount of work goes into setting them up for which we do sincerely thank our Council staff. I look forward to attending more events, ones to which I am invited as well as ones which I will be hosting – and I look forward to seeing you along the way.



With Euro 2016 adding to the country's obsession with its favourite sport, football, it's no wonder boys and girls up and down the country dream of becoming the stars of the future. The reality is only a select few make it to the top, but there are lots of opportunities for talented young footballers looking to fulfil their ambitions, both on and off the pitch.

The Football Development programme at Central Bedfordshire College, based at Creasey Park Community Football Centre, aims to do just that. A direct link with Luton Town Football Club provides talented young footballers with the coaching and competitive opportunities to develop their game and provide formal sport and coaching qualifications for their future careers

The programme allows students to train as professional footballers while studying one of a wide range of specific sports programmes. There are six hours training per week and they can play in one of three squads.

Alongside this they attend lessons on their chosen course towards a formally recognised qualification. Courses are offered at different levels and they can also study for additional F.A. approved coaching qualifications. The most talented have the opportunity to progress onto Luton Town FC's successful Youth Development Programmes with seven graduates now playing in the Premier League.



Head of programme Colin Sharpe who is passionate about giving students access to top level football development alongside their academic studies, said: "Our partnership with Dunstable Town Council allows students to train in dedicated facilities on superb pitches at Creasey Park

Community Football Centre. This coupled with the exceptional teaching facilities at the newly refurbished college campus means students get the best of both worlds and are prepared for their future careers whether that's in football or another sporting or coaching area.

The College prides itself on being more academically focused rather than selling false promises to the students. and the department has achieved 91% academic success and is the only college in the area to be awarded a Grade 2 by Ofsted twice in a row. The football standards are also high and the programme has produced the talented Crystal Palaces premiership player Keishi Anderson. The college's squads have scooped seven league titles and two league cups.

Junior Wardens is an exciting initiative that the Town Council runs in partnership with St Augustine's Academy in Downside. Currently, there are 15 members of St Augustine's Junior Wardens.

The aim of the project is to promote pride of place and to equip the young people attending with the means to make a difference to their community. The young people looked at the impact of litter for the first term of the project; this included having guest speakers from the Wildlife Trust, Central

Bedfordshire Council and the RSPCA. To conclude the first term's topic, the Junior Wardens took part in a litter pick around the school grounds.

During the second term, the topic has been around road safety. Richard Denton the Children and Young People Development Officer and Schools Coordinator for Bedfordshire Police came to talk to the group about Personal Safety and Police powers on the road. The group went on an estate 'BRAKE' walk in conjunction with the National Charity BRAKE that exists to promote road safety. The young people engaged well and motorists passing by were respectful of slowing

down and giving the group a wave. Over the term the young people have learnt the dangers and impacts of motorists not abiding by the speed limit, the issues of potholes and the damage they can cause, and about cyclists and road safety.

Enhanced Town Centre Cleansing

Later this year the Council will be launching an extension to the existing Town Ranger service that will focus purely on the town centre. Whenever possible the service will operate seven days a week. By using a range of specialist cleaning equipment, this new service will help to ensure that the street scene in and around Dunstable town centre will be kept to the very highest standards.





Priory House Undercroft Restoration

Priory House is one of the most important buildings in Dunstable. A Grade 2* listed structure, the House (and particularly the Undercroft), is in need of considerable restoration. The Council has secured funding from CBC and Historic England to help fund the required feasibility study that will ultimately lead to a major works programme that will be carried out over the next few years.

Back in October last year, Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) launched a grant aid programme called the 'Market Town Regeneration Fund' (MTRF) that aimed to help regenerate market towns across Central Bedfordshire. The fund was designed for town and parish councils to bid for funding to deliver projects in their towns and villages that would help to regenerate areas, specifically town centres.

Architectural Lighting Scheme

Aiming to lift the entrances to the town and improving the night time street scene, this project will result in the installation of architectural lighting on Grove House, Priory House and the Dunstable Conference Centre. It is hoped that the new lighting will be launched in time for Christmas.



New Entrance Features for Priory Gardens

Similar to the entrance feature for Grove House Gardens, the Council will be installing a new entrance feature to Priory Gardens from the A5. This project will complete the restoration of entrance features for the Gardens following the completion of the listed Priory Gateway entrance from Church Street.

Dunstable Town Council put together a strong bid that has led to the projects highlighted here receiving up to £1million of partnership funding, which together with required matched funding will lead to over £2million worth of investment in and around the town centre over the next couple of years.

The Town Council will be leading on this scheme for Dunstable and hopes to secure a significant element of the £1million to ensure that as many premises in the town centre benefit from this initiative.



New Town Centre Signage and Street Furniture

Post de-trunking of the A5, the Council will be installing new signage and street furniture in and around the town centre including new information signs at the White Lion Guided Bus Way stop.



A New Splash Park, Beach Area and Catering Outlet for Bennett Memorial Recreation Ground

This exciting project will provide a wonderful new facility for all residents and visitors to Dunstable. Situated in Bennett Memorial Recreation Ground, the new facility will enhance the outdoor space already provided and see the sports pavilion transformed into a new cafeteria.



Quadrant Shopping Centre Refurbishment

The new owners of the Quadrant Shopping Centre will soon be making an investment in the complex to improve its overall appearance. Through the MTRF the Council will be assisting with this investment with a view to also facilitating the re-opening of the public toilets.

This edition we go right to the top and Dunstable Town Council's Town Clerk and Chief Executive. In this edition we shine the spotlight on what it is like to be David 'The Boss' Ashlee.

You have been the Town Clerk and Chief Executive for 10 years now, what would you say has been the most noticeable difference in **Dunstable?**

The biggest difference to Dunstable has been the population growth and increased diversity. Similarly, the Council has also grown, both in terms of variety of services delivered, staff employed and growth in turnover.

What did you do before you came to **Dunstable?**

I have worked in local government now for over 30 years (yes I know I look far too young!). I started my career as a life guard in a leisure centre and over the years worked in many different roles for 3 different authorities.

My role immediately prior to coming to Dunstable was as Head of Department responsible for corporate performance. crime and disorder reduction and Community Planning as well as a range of community based services such as museums, leisure facilities and sports development.

Your role must be very challenging, what is the most challenging aspect of being a town clerk?

Being responsible for millions of pounds of public money and a large number of staff that do very different jobs.

What would you say you enjoy the most about your role?

Probably the variety of my work and I have to admit to enjoy being "the boss".

I hear you're a keen golfer. What is your handicap?

My biggest handicap is that I don't get to play enough because of my job! Whilst I am a keen golfer, I am not very good and play off 28.

Who is the most famous person you

Princess Diana – she opened the first leisure centre that I worked for in Kidderminster in 1986.

What do you think will change in Dunstable in the next 5 years?

There is no doubt that the Guided Busway will continue to have an impact on the town as a catalyst for further regeneration investment. The new A5-M1 Link Road, Woodside Connection and associated de-trunking of the A5 will also have a positive effect on the town. Ultimately, with further housing and employment growth, I think the economic outlook for Dunstable is extremely promising and whilst I know that some people struggle with the fact that Dunstable is no longer a cosy, quaint market town, the reality is that it has not been one for many years now, but it is, and will be, a prosperous and vibrant place in which to live, work and visit

If you could provide any service to the residents of Dunstable what would it be and why?

I would like the Council to own and manage a golf course (but that is for selfish reasons!!). I just want the Council to continue to grow and manage as great a range of quality of life services as is reasonable in an efficient and effective manner. The Town Council only exists to add value to the range and quality of public services in Dunstable and whilst I genuinely believe the Council does a great job already; I also think there is always more we can do given the right resources. Ultimately, to really answer the question properly, I would ask our residents.

If you could be chief executive for any other organisation what would it be and why?

Probably an organisation like the World Health Organisation or the International Monetary Fund. Such organisations are hugely powerful and have the capacity to do so much good in the world. Failing that I think the FA have a job vacancy at the moment!

If you could have any super power what would it be and why?

I would like the ability to alleviate pain, poverty and suffering and to promote aspiration.



More Green Flag Success in 2016

Two of the town's parks are among many others in the region that continue to fly a Green Flag Award, after being judged to be among the best in the country. Priory and Grove House Gardens have retained their Green Flag Award status again this year for the sixth year running. The awards show that these parks have met the high and exacting standards required of the Green Flag Award Scheme.

The Green Flag Awards Scheme is run by the environmental charity Keep Britain Tidy and the parks were judged in May this year by two green-space experts, who volunteer their time each year. They assessed the parks against eight strict criteria, including horticultural standards, cleanliness, sustainability and community involvement.

The Chair of Dunstable Town Council's Grounds and Environmental Services Committee, Councillor Liz Jones, said: "We are delighted to have retained our Green Flag Awards again in 2016 and I was very proud to be able to attend the award ceremony in Nottingham to collect this year's flags. The awards are testament to the hard work that the Town Council staff and the wider community put in to maintaining these award winning spaces for all to enjoy."
