

Creasey Park Community Football Centre will also be improving with an investment to its catering facilities and hopefully residents will also have noticed all the new park signage that has recently been installed across the town.

Elsewhere in this edition of Talk of the Town readers will learn about the new 'Men in Sheds' initiative being launched by the Council as well as the ongoing work the Council is engaged in with the 'Dunstable in Bloomers' for this year's Anglia in Bloom entry. The Council is also looking forward to the launch of the newly restored Priory Gateway complete with new gates and I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Friends of Priory House and Gardens for all their support with this initiative.



All volunteers are fully insured and DBS checked. Most help is free, unless expenses such as petrol or parking have been incurred.





# **Dunstable Town Centre**

Town Centre Manager - Clare Brett

The heart of Dunstable is the town centre and this issue we shine the spotlight on Clare Brett, the Town Centre Manager. Let's find out her ideas and thoughts on Dunstable and what is in store for the future of the town centre...

# You have worked for Dunstable Town Council now for 15 years, in that time you have worked a variety of positions. Tell us more about what your roles have been?

I started work for the Town Council back in 2001 as the Events Assistant. I was also involved with the refurbishment and opening of Priory House Heritage Centre before becoming Town Centre Co-ordinator and working more closely with the town centre businesses. I became Town Centre Manager in 2012 when Dunstable Town Council took over the management of the Ashton Square Toilet facility and took on Dunstable Market. Working in a variety of roles has meant that I have enjoyed a very varied working life at the Town Council that has also given me the opportunity to work with colleagues from all departments.

# There is a lot of talk about the future of Dunstable and the effects of the new trunk road. How do you think this will benefit the town centre?

When the A5 through Dunstable is 'detrunked', heavy goods vehicles will be taken away from the town centre, which should reduce congestion and improve air quality. The detrunking will happen following the completion of the A5-M1 Link Road and both schemes should have a positive impact on the traffic and town centre environment. The responsibility for the road will transfer to Central Bedfordshire Council as the Highways Authority and there may also be opportunities for Central Bedfordshire Council to improve the street scene, removing railings, putting in new furniture and improving signage.

# Your job role is very varied, working with the market, toilets and the important work with the businesses. What do you enjoy most about your role?

It is the huge variety that keeps the job fresh and interesting which I enjoy most. No two days are the same and I could be involved with anything from event planning to changing a light bulb or even writing a blog!

# You have recently started writing a news column in The Gazette and an online blog. Are you enjoying writing these and what is the main purpose of doing this?

Blog writing is something quite new to me and requires the development of new skills which I am still working on! In most of the things I have to write I don't need to include 'personality', but the blog format in particular requires a much more informal and personal style. So yes, I am enjoying the challenge, but welcome any help or suggestions for topics that people would be interested in!

# You manage Dunstable Market; tell us why people should start shopping on the market, and importantly why people should shop local?

Dunstable is an historic market town and the market is very much at its heart. We are all aware that shopping habits and lifestyles have changed but there really is no substitute for the shopping experience and personal service that you can receive from an independent retailer or trader who gets to know you over a period of time. Some of our businesses in town have been

operating for a long time and the traders on the market are no exception. These businesses really know their customers and will go the extra mile to get the product they want. This personal service and traditional experience is unique and in order to keep town centres alive we need to use them as much as possible.

# If you could choose, what shops would you like to see in Dunstable?


Whilst we have some wonderful independent retailers in our town centre, I feel that one of the things that would attract people into Dunstable would be an improved retail offer. So as someone who enjoys some retail therapy, I would just like to add to the shopping experience available with a range of different retailers that we don't already have.

# If you were a superhero what special power would you have?

I would like to be able to control the weather. It is lovely to have different seasons and to experience these as we go through the year, but as part of the team who operate the market, life would be much easier if the weather wasn't always so unpredictable!

Dunstable Market operates in the Ashton Square area every Wednesday, Friday and Saturday throughout the year.





This Grade I listed Scheduled Ancient Monument is all that remains of the Dunstable Priory gatehouse. Last November, with the help of grants from Historic England and Central Bedfordshire Council, the Town Council completed the stone renovation of the gateway. This involved removing all the cement used in the previous repairs, repairing and replacing damaged and missing stones and repairing and repointing all the stonework using lime mortar.

In the coming months a new pair of oak gates will be hung in the gateway to complete the restoration works and new interpretation panels will be installed to give visitors more information about the history of the structure. The purchase of the new gates has been made possible thanks to donations from a number of organisations and businesses in the town that have contributed to meet half the costs. They are:

Chez Jerome, Dunstable and District Local History Society, Dunstable Joint Committee, Dunstable Rotary Club, Friends of Priory House and Gardens, Waterside Estates Ltd and The Watling Street Club

The Friends of Priory House and Gardens and the Archaeologist from Central Bedfordshire Council have supported the Town Council throughout this project and it would not have been possible to complete the restoration without their support.

The former Priory and the Gatehouse have a rich history and here below is one of the many incidents that have taken place around the gateway throughout the ages:

A Violent Incident The Priory Annals record an incident which took place at the gateway on 16 December 1276, when a group of the king's falconers, who were staying at the Priory, had an altercation with some of the canons and the chaplain. Later in the evening the falconers, and some of their friends, went out into the streets of Dunstable where they fatally wounded the chaplain. When they were refused re-entry by the gatekeeper he was beaten up and they then stormed through the Priory causing further injuries.

The alarm was raised by the pealing of the bells and the people of the town ran to intervene, but still the Prior, William, struggled to contain the fighting.

The following day, the falconers went to the king and complained about their treatment and levelled serious accusations against the Prior. Edward I referred the matter to the local justice, Roger Seyton, who sat at Dunstable. When twelve local men swore on oath that the Prior, the canons and the townspeople were not at fault, the king refused to accept this and came in person to the town.

At a later hearing, thirty-six men from outside the locality declared before the king that there was no case to answer by the Prior. It would appear though that the falconer's actions went unpunished.
