This year the Council has been able to set a budget that will enable a bid to be submitted to Central Bedfordshire Council for a grant to fund a range of projects that will benefit the town centre under their Market Town Regeneration Fund programme. At the time of writing this introduction the bid is still being prepared but the Council is confident that a strong case for funding will be made, so fingers crossed!

If you live in a Band D property in Dunstable you will pay an annual charge of £175.21 to Dunstable Town Council which is just a £3.43 increase on last year's charge. An illustration of the services provided by the Council is given later in this edition of Talk of the Town, and a full article will be presented on the Market Town Regeneration Fund in the next edition once the Council knows if it has been successful with its bid.

The spring sees the launch of the Council's events programme and this year the Council will be kicking things off with two events in April and May. St George's Day will be celebrated with an improved range of activities centred in Priory Gardens and May sees the return of the very popular 'Around the World' event that will again take place in Priory Gardens. Please note that the Beer and Cider Festival will take place at a later date in September this year but it will once again be bigger and better than ever. The Council will also be staging the annual Town Meeting on 11 April at Creasey Park Community Football Centre. Everyone is welcome to attend.



Market Town Regeneration Fund

Back in November, Central Bedfordshire Council launched the £4m Market Town Regeneration Fund to help improve market towns, inviting town councils to bid for a share of the capital funding. Dunstable Town Council has therefore submitted a bid for a share of these funds for the town and hopefully we will know if we have been successful by the time this edition of the Talk of the Town comes out!

As part of work on the application for the funds, a town centre benchmarking exercise was undertaken. The purpose of the research was to develop baseline data about Dunstable but also to get your opinion and that of our visitors and business as to what is good and bad about the town and your ideas to improve it.

So thank you for taking the time to assist with this research. We had a good return on the visitor's survey with over 360 people participating. Respondents expressed support for shop front improvements and felt that the appearance of the town centre was a negative. However, Priory House was viewed as an asset to the town, along with the parks and gardens.



Spotlight On...





Bereavement Services Cemetery Manager – Mary Dobbs

In this edition of Talk of the Town we shine the Spotlight on Mary Dobbs. Mary is the Cemetery Manager at Dunstable Cemetery and has worked there for one year. The Cemetery was built in 1861 and has been in use for over 150 years. Let's shine the spotlight and find out more about what it is like working in such a unique place and providing such an important service.

You have been in post now for one year, how are you settling in?

I am settling in very well. I enjoy coming to work every day. I was in my previous employment for a number of years, my only regret is that I did not join the bereavement service before now. I also feel very lucky that my office is located in a converted chapel in the grounds of the Cemetery.

Can you give us an idea what a working day is like for you?

I am in the Cemetery office from 8.00 am until 4.00 pm, Monday to Friday. My days are varied and no two days are the same. I greet all funerals that come into the Cemetery and accompany them to the graveside. I liaise with Funeral Directors to arrange dates for burials that are to take place in the Cemetery. I meet with members of the public, take telephone enquiries relating to grave searches, administration queries and genealogy searches.

Dunstable Cemetery is introducing a number of new services and options for the residents, could you give more details on these?

We have just finished preparing our new Cemetery extension and have taken the opportunity to introduce hand-crafted, solid granite ashes sanctums and memorial kerb blocks. Ashes sanctums are above ground burial chambers, large enough to receive two standard-sized ashes caskets with a granite plaque on the front. The memorial kerb blocks are made of polished granite and come in blocks of three. This means that they could be used as either a dedicated family block or as three individual blocks.

You must have some difficult days, how do you like to relax and unwind?

I do not have many difficult days, because I enjoy my job so much, I do not see them in that way. I do enjoy reading and going for long walks. I love visiting stately homes and country parks. If my day has been particularly difficult, I just like going home and having some quiet time.

Dunstable Cemetery has a lot of history from War Graves to the former Mayors of Dunstable being buried there. Can you share any other interesting facts?

Yes, there are many interesting people buried in Dunstable Cemetery - William Hambling was born in Snape in Suffolk. He was Master of Chews Charity School from 1856 -1880. He did much for the town of Dunstable; he was Church Warden at the Priory Church, he founded the Dunstable Rifle Corps, was a Town Magistrate and Mayor of Dunstable from 1880/82 and 1887/90. He was also the leader of Hambling Seedling and developed a new strain of apple which was named after him, he died in 1898. Saplings of Hambling apple trees have recently been planted around the town to mark the Chew's anniversary.

Do you have any plans or projects for the future?

We have recently completed a refurbishment of the Chapel and are currently resurfacing a number of our pathways. Both Priory Gardens & Grove House Gardens have been awarded the Green Flag. We are working towards obtaining a Green Flag for the Cemetery.

In your job role what skills and traits do you require?

To be compassionate, a good listener and be able to empathise is very important. To have an interest in helping people. From an administration point of view, attention to detail is very important and to be able to work in an organised way. The job role also demands that you have an ability to work to fixed procedures and legal requirements.

What do you enjoy the most about your role?

This particular time in someone's life can be very distressing. I get a lot of satisfaction from being able to do all that I can to help. I enjoy being in the Cemetery grounds and meeting visitors. A member of the public once said to me how much they appreciate a welcome when they visit the Cemetery.

Is there anything people might not realise about the Cemetery that you can share?

The first burial took place in Dunstable Cemetery on 22 October 1861 and was that of James Turney, the four-year-old son of a local groom who lived in Church Street. The Cemetery is also home to wildlife such as green woodpeckers, kites and badgers. There are also many notable trees including a group of Scots Pine, known as the 'Drovers Pines'.

And finally, If you were Prime Minister for the day what would you do?

If I was Prime minister for a day I would abolish VAT for that day.
