Introduction

These matters came to the attention of BDO LLP during the audit of the annual return for the year ended 31 March 2016. These state that we are the auditors of the town council, but as we do not audit the FRSSE accounts it is misleading to attach our name to these accounts. These also state that the FRSSE accounts are required under the Audit and Accounts Regulations 2010, which is not correct.

What do we recommend you do?

We request that our name is removed from the FRSSE accounts or made clearer that we are auditors of the council's annual return only.
